This award is presented at the annual educational conference in honor of Burton J. Buhrke. Mr. Buhrke served over 50 years in the law enforcement field with over 35 years at the Chicago Police Department and 15 years with the Illinois State Police laboratory system. He is credited with providing training to many of the fingerprint examiners in Illinois and is best known for his work in the Richard Speck case. This is the highest award that can be bestowed by the Illinois Division of the I.A.I. (IDIAI). This award is not necessarily presented each year and should be considered for accomplishments of the greatest significance, similar to a lifetime achievement award. This award is intended to recognize individuals who have significantly contributed to the furtherance of the goals and standards of the identification disciplines and/or the IDIAI.
